Surf Life Saving Northern Beaches is once again seeking expressions of interest from volunteer surf lifesavers to become Coastal Ambassadors. The focus of the course is to gain in-depth understanding of our unique coastal marine systems. Positive outcomes include understanding your local environment and passing that knowledge onto fellow club members and beach visitors.

Workshop participants will receive in-depth training in:

- Human impacts on coastal systems
- Beach formation and coastal processes
- Sandy beach ecology
- Animals and plants of the intertidal rocky shores
- Sensitive habitats including rock platforms, sand dunes, beach plants & seagrass beds

Coastal Ambassadors will be trained by prominent marine scientist, Dr. Arthur Dye, with support from Pittwater Council's Coastal Environment Centre. An information kit will be made available to each surf club member and training is provided free of charge. Participants will benefit from three evening workshops and two half day field trips. At the end of the course, Coastal Ambassadors will be able to share their knowledge and enthusiasm for conserving coastal habitats and promote the responsible enjoyment of our coastal environment with fellow surf club members and the general public.
